## Pollinator Exploration Kit (Available for Loan)

Calling all educators: teachers, naturalists, gardeners, park rangers, camp counselors, outdoor/environmental educators, home-school parents, childcare professionals, and more! Bee City USA – Hendersonville is eager to help you share the wonder of pollinators with children you teach. Whether exploring your own backyard, schoolyard, or a local park, you'll find many helpful tools in our Pollinator Exploration Kit. The kit includes sets of 12 sturdy child-size insect nets, special bug capture bubbles, bug boxes with magnifying lids, and magnifying glasses. Two pop-up insect habitats and two sets of laminated fold-out field guides (NC Trees & Wildflowers, NC Butterflies & Moths, Bees & Other Pollinators) are also included. As available, the kit is available for loan for up to a week.

## **POLLINATOR HEALTH & HABITAT**

# 5-acre Pollinator Meadow along Oklawaha Greenway

With technical assistance from Bryan Tompkins at US Fish and Wildlife Service, a previously cleared 5-acre plot along Oklawaha Greenway was planted with a native pollinator-friendly seed mix (from Ernst Conservation Seeds).

# May 4: NeighborWoods Project at Green Meadows Community

#### October 19: NeighborWoods Project at Green Meadows Community. 10 a.m.

Tree Board distributed eight free trees to residents who requested them through this program. Tree-planting demo was included by a Tree Board volunteer. Green Meadows is an established neighborhood in need of more trees to provide aesthetic enjoyment and a sense of comfort.

October 19: NeighborWoods Project at Oklawaha Village. 12 noon. Tree Board distributed eleven trees with a tree-planting demo in this recently-built neighborhood. Land was cleared for new construction. Delivery of free trees to interested homeowners was very welcomed.

## **POLICIES & PRACTICES**

Pesticides are not used in designated pollinator habitat and other sensitive sites (except when targeted herbicide use is deemed the best option for invasive or noxious weed management). Mulching is used to reduce weeds in raised bed pollinator demonstration gardens. Weeds are hand-pulled.
