
Report on 2020

Pollinator Habitat Creation & Enhancement

East Georgia State College hosted its annual Arbor Tree Celebration on March 6, 2020. About 30 participants were on hand to witness the planting of a pollinator-friendly weeping willow tree on the EGSC campus, while listening to a community forestry specialist with the Georgia Forestry Commission talk about the meaning of Arbor Day and how to plant and care for trees. At the event, mason bee houses were on display and pollinator-friendly Dogwood, Willow Oak, Catalpa, and Swamp Chestnut tree seedlings were given away for attendees to enjoy in their home gardens. The celebration was hosted by EGSC's Tree Campus USA committee which compliments the college's Bee Campus USA affiliation.
