
# Bee City USA - Garden City

The Boise Watershed added a native plant/pollinator habitat area to their site. The Meridian Co-op Garden (a community vegetable garden) added pollinator-friendly plants using our pollinator habitat as a guide. I believe there were many more pollinator-friendly plants added in our area, but don't know how to track that.








## Education & Outreach

We were able to hold 2 of our Bee City USA Speaker Series lectures. "Beneficial Insects and your Garden", and "Native Plants for Pollinators" before the shutdown, with 80 – 100 guests each. Our committee also hosted a Pollinator Celebration at a local nursery during National Pollinator Week. Sadly, it was very poorly attended. Idaho Botanical Garden offered 2 different classes about pollinators. I gave a presentation to a local garden club about our native pollinators. The Idaho Community Trees newsletter contained a nice article titled "Be a Bee City!". Over 800 books, published by our committee, titled "100 Treasure Valley Pollinator Plants" were sold.
