Education & Outreach

All year long, The Wetlands Education Center at Cattail Marsh designated the first Saturday of the month as a "pollinator day" for the Cattail Explorers arts and crafts workshops. In January, two committee members set up a booth at The Beaumont Children's Museum for the Critters and Creatures Day. We offered native seeds and educated children about pollinators. In February of 2021, we hosted a community screening with the Magnolia Garden Club of Disney's Wings of Life. We invited other local conservation groups to display their information in the lobby of the historic downtown Jefferson Theater. The community was invited at no charge. Many school age students came with their parents. After the film, we had a raffle drawing and a short Q and A session. It was a big success as we estimated 200 people were in attendance. In April, Cattail marsh hosted a pollinator activity for Earth Day had over 50 kids come out and plant pollinators. In the fall, Bee City – Beaumont partnered with the Magnolia Garden Club to distribute pollinator information and native seeds at The Beaumont Farmers Market. In October, hosted ghosts, goblins, gardens event with all the garden clubs of Beaumont and celebrated the importance of pollinators and the impact of growing pollinators in their backyard. Pamplets were made and distributed teaching the importance. Over 800 in attendance.
