Pollinator Habitat Creation & Enhancement

The Ypsilanti Senior Center, a facility of the City of Ypsilanti, partnered with Eagle Scout Juno Ryan and volunteers, who re-planted the flower beds in front of the Ypsilanti Senior Center with native flowers that attract pollinators. The plants included were Eastern Red Columbine, Wild Geranium, Short's Aster, Virginia Bluebells, Canada Anemone, Zigzag Goldenrod, Butterfly Weed, and Bee Balm. They also placed bee houses in the garden out front and in the community garden around the back, three in total.

Education & Outreach

Festival of the Honey Bee was held for its 9th year. Though it was a smaller production due to the global pandemic, residents of Ypsilanti still came out to celebrate. We had an outdoor street festival that featured the Pollinator Drag Revue hosted by Queen Bee Pixie Mae Barnes, and had live performance and a dance party to wrap up the night. Artist vendors took to the theme, and Bee Present Honey brought their educational activities to engage with the kids. Simultaneously, Local Art Gallery 22 North held their annual exhibition named "Beeline: The Festival of the Honeybee Art Exhibition", our icecream shop featured local honey icecream, Maniacal Mead Company debuted their new tasting room, along with other pollinator art and educational events happening around the city for First Fridays Ypsilanti.
